Mark Gainforth – Unionville-Sebewaing Area HS

In just 24 years Coach Mark Gainforth created a dynasty at USA high school. He has won an amazing 423 games to only 133 losses, with a winning percentage of over 75%. His boys' teams have amassed 13 conference championships, 14 districts, 4 regionals, one final four and were state runners up in 2005.

A life-long resident of the Unionville area, he began coaching junior high basketball fresh out of college in 1979. From there he moved on to JV, but then spent a 7 year stint as an assistant men's basketball coach at SVSU. Finally in 1996, Mark obtained the varsity boy's job at USA. Along the way he also coached boy's varsity track now and again, winning a MiTCA Class C state title in 2006. Four times he



was voted BCAM Regional Coach of the Year and was named BCAM Class C COY in 2005. He is a five-time All-Thumb Coach of the Year. Mark was a teacher, counselor, assistant principal, principal and interim superintendent for USA schools for 26 years.

Mark has a lot of people he would like to thank! He says his success would not have been possible without the patience and sacrifice from wife Brenda, and children Shaun, Isaiah and Megan. Coach Chad Mortimer coached for 23 years at Hanover-Horton High School and during that tenure he did not even have 100 losses! His 454 – 98 record figures out to an 82% winning percentage. In almost all of his 23 seasons, Coach Mortimer's teams have been able to bring home at least one end-of-season trophy. He boasts 14 league championships, 18 district championships, 9 regionals, and 3 final fours (2003, 2016 and 2021).

Chad has been awarded numerous coach of the year awards for his teams' success including multiple Cascade Conference COYs (including the last 4 years in a row). He is a 4 time BCAM regional COY, and has also won multiple Jackson area coach of the year

awards. He builds his program with hard working kids and starts at the ground level with a very successful youth program. He gives back to his community and spends countless hours at the school.

This is not a typo, Bruce Koopman has amassed 751 wins in 32 years including 504 with the boys' program and 247 with the girls' program all at McBain High School. During that time he has lost just 248 games for over a 75% winning percentage. Coach Koopman's teams have won 20 conference championships, 18 districts, 7 regionals, 4 final fours were state runners up in 2011 and State Champions in 2002. Coach is a three-time BCAM Regional Coach of the Year winner for boys and was AP Class C Girls Coach of the Year in 1994 as well as the BCAM Class C Girls COY that same year.

He considers his success his players' success and said he has been blessed to coach so many wonderful student athletes from a small



rural northern Michigan farming town. He attributes his program's excellence to hardworking kids that believed in the program, played with character, played hard and played as a team.

Bruce said first and foremost he has to thank his wife Lisa for all her support and patience for 33 years.
